



Declaration for a Child Care System in Canada Presented to the United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child

Whereas federal, provincial and territorial governments in Canada have affirmed their commitments to the Convention on the Rights of the Child and to the Convention on the Elimination of all forms of Discrimination Against Women, both of which recognize that parents have primary responsibility for their children and that government's role is to ensure that families have the support necessary to carry out their responsibilities, including child care,

And

Whereas a compelling body of research shows that universal access to quality, affordable, inclusive and not-for-profit child care supports children's healthy development, advances women's equality, promotes work/life balance for parents, reduces crime, prevents violence against women, addresses child and family poverty, deepens social inclusion and grows the economy,

And

Whereas multiple international assessments rank Canada poorly among developed countries because child care, particularly outside of Quebec, is neither accessible nor affordable for most families,

And

Whereas low wages in Canada's child care sector have led to a crisis in recruiting and retaining the well-trained, socially-valued staff that are essential to promoting equality for women and quality in child care programs,

And

Whereas the lack of access to quality, affordable child care programs in Canada today places our children's healthy development at risk and increases stress on families,

We, the undersigned,

Call on the federal, provincial and territorial governments of Canada to fulfill their human rights commitments with regard to child care.
